<p>Outcomes for pupils in receipt of PPG (July 2013):</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Norwood Pupil Premium outcomes in all subjects, reading and maths are well above the national outcomes for this group of children and just above in writing.• 100% pupils in receipt of Pupil Premium at Norwood exited Key Stage 1 in line with national expectations for Reading and Maths, achieving well above this group nationally. Norwood Pupil premium attainment for pupils exiting Key stage 1 in writing was in line with this group nationally.• Norwood Pupil Premium pupils excelled in reading at the end of Key Stage 1 with 29% achieving level 3 which was almost double the national average.• Outcomes for Y3, Y4 and Y5 pupils, in receipt of Pupil Premium, were better than this group nationally in reading, writing and maths.• Norwood Pupil Premium pupils achieved well with 100% achieving level 4 or above in reading and writing.• 75% Year 6 pupils achieved level 4 or above in mathematics.

<u>Phonics enhanced provision</u> Pupils have received 1:1 tuition and regular small group support through the Read, Write Inc programme.	£2934	67% <i>Pupil Premium</i> pupils passed the Year 1 phonics test, well above this group nationally.
<u>Family library and ICT access</u> Pupils in receipt of pupil premium were signposted to this provision with a HLTA. Utilising the time to read with an adult and change reading/ library books.	£3,803	Outcomes for all <i>Pupil Premium</i> pupils in Year 3-6 were good or better than the same group nationally.
<u>Sensory circuits programme</u> Pupils receive daily sessions to support a smooth start to the day through alerting, organising and calming activities.	£5,412	3 pupils no longer require the circuit. 4 pupils have made progress with physical needs according to physiotherapy assessments. All pupils feel that sensory circuits help them to be prepared for the start of the school day.
<u>Booster sessions for accelerated progress in core subjects</u> Pupils within Year 2 and Year 6 receive small group booster sessions in order to focus upon individual targets within reading, writing and maths.	£17,712	100% pupils in receipt of <i>Pupil Premium</i> at Norwood exited Key Stage 1 in line with national expectations for Reading and Maths, achieving well above this group nationally. Outcomes for Norwood <i>Pupil Premium</i> pupils exiting Key stage 1 in writing was in line with this group nationally. Norwood <i>Pupil Premium</i> pupils achieved well with 100% achieving level 4 or above in reading and writing. 75% Year 6 <i>Pupil Premium</i> pupils achieved level 4 or above in mathematics.
<u>Lunch club access for vulnerable pupils</u> Vulnerable pupils have priority places at lunch club to promote a calm and relaxed lunch hour.	£1827	Pupils enjoy lunch club and those with priority access use this provision to good effect to have a calm lunch hour with the support of planned activities.
<u>Clicker 6</u> A word processing programme which supports pupils with spelling, punctuation and composition skills.	£450	Norwood Pupil premium attainment for pupils exiting Key stage 1 in writing was in line with this group nationally. Outcomes for Y3, Y4 and Y5 pupils, in receipt of Pupil Premium, were better than this group nationally in writing. Norwood Pupil Premium pupils achieved well with 100% achieving level 4 or above in writing.
<u>Social skills</u> Individual pupils are supported by a skilled Higher Level Teaching assistant with anger management, self esteem and friendship difficulties.	£521	Pupils who access this provision feel a bond with this HLTA and able to discuss their feelings. As a result of this provision, there has been a positive impact upon the behaviour and attitudes of individual pupils.
