<p>The funding from the Pupil Premium was allocated in the following ways:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">◆ Allocate time for the Pupil Premium lead to monitor pupils, track data and identify next steps for pupils
<ul style="list-style-type: none">◆ Teaching assistants to deliver one to one and small group reading intervention
<ul style="list-style-type: none">◆ Higher level teaching assistants to deliver English booster groups in Year 2 and Year 6
<ul style="list-style-type: none">◆ Train teachers in the Read Write Inc programme to ensure good quality teaching of reading and writing
<ul style="list-style-type: none">◆ Higher level teaching assistant to deliver a nurture group to support pupils' social and emotional skills
<ul style="list-style-type: none">◆ Train reading leaders to professionally develop teachers to deliver quality reading teaching
<ul style="list-style-type: none">◆ Train teaching assistants to deliver one to one reading teaching to fill the gaps
<ul style="list-style-type: none">◆ Provide school uniform vouchers
<ul style="list-style-type: none">◆ Enable pupils and their families to access visits, trips, performances and the Sports Summer School to develop social, emotional and physical needs and ensure all pupils are able to participate in school trips which are part of the curriculum.
<ul style="list-style-type: none">◆ Reading materials to enable pupils to take home reading books that reflect their ability
<ul style="list-style-type: none">◆ Kindles to encourage pupil enjoyment of reading
<ul style="list-style-type: none">◆ Develop learning conversations within the Assertive Mentoring programme, involving staff and parents, to drive school improvement and raise the attainment of pupils working below age related expectations
<ul style="list-style-type: none">◆ Purchase additional electronic reading resources to engage pupils and improve rates of reading progress in Year 4.

Measuring the impact of the Pupil Premium funding

- ◆ 100% Year 1 pupils are on track to achieve a level 2 in reading, writing and maths by the end of Key Stage 1
- ◆ 100% Year 5 pupils are on track to achieve a level 4 in English and Maths at the end of Key Stage 2
- ◆ In Year 2 the gap between Pupil Premium and Non-Pupil Premium in reading and writing is closed
- ◆ 100% pupils in Year 3 are on track for two levels progress in writing and maths.
- ◆ The gap in reading and writing in Year 4 is narrow and not significant.
- ◆ Within Year 5 the gap between Pupil Premium and non-Pupil Premium pupils has closed in reading, writing and maths
- ◆ In Year 6 the gap between Pupil Premium and Non-Pupil Premium is closed in reading, writing and maths
- ◆ Discussions with pupils identified that 100% enjoyed reading on their Kindle and felt that it would encourage them to read more often
- ◆ Feedback from parents of pupils on our reading scheme, felt that the reading material was better matched to their child's ability and gave them a confidence boost
- ◆ An audit of reading teaching, showed that adults felt more confident at delivering reading and writing activities in phonics following master-classes administered by the Reading Leader
