A Parent's Guide to Apprenticeships







As a parent, you want your child to get the best possible start in their career. There are many options available to young people after they leave school, and in this guide, we outline information and benefits about apprenticeships as a key route into a successful career.

What is an apprenticeship?

It is a genuine job, with training, meaning you can earn while you learn and gain a nationally recognised qualification.

The minimum wage for apprentices is £3.90 per hour, but many employers pay more than this. This is dependent on the sector, and level of the apprenticeship

All apprenticeships include elements of on the job and off the job training leading to industry recognised standards or qualifications. Some apprenticeships will require an assessment at the end of the programme to assess the apprentice`s ability and competence in their job role.

More details on salaries and entry criteria in specific apprenticeship occupations can be accessed by looking at the vacancies on 'Find an apprenticeship.'

The government has stated that all young people must stay in some form of education or training until at least their 18th birthday.

This does not necessarily mean staying in school; young people have a choice about how they continue in education or training post 16, which could be through an apprenticeship or traineeship.

What levels are there?

Name	Level	Equivalent educational level
Intermediate	2	5 GCSE passes at grades A* - C or 9 - 4
Advanced	3	2 A level passes
Higher	4, 5, 6 & 7	Foundation degree and above
Degree	6 & 7	Bachelor's or masters degree

You may be required to complete an assessment with an external assessor at the end of your training to complete your apprenticeship qualification and assess your competence and ability. Your assessor will fully support you in this.

On completion of your apprenticeship training you may potentially be offered a full time position within the company you have completed your training in, or be offered a progression route to a higher level of study.
