Dear Parents/Carers,

As you are aware, our performance at The Queen Katharine Academy is fast approaching and so it is time to think about costumes for the performance.

We have tried to keep it as simple as possible. Please can all those who are in the dance but not acting wear grey trousers, a grey skirt or dress with a white shirt. If a dress is worn, please have shorts underneath. Please can you make this clothing look well-worn i.e. ripped, put through the mud etc. Also, please can all of the girls have 'wacky' hairstyles such as space buns, high bunches or something similar.

In addition to this, please can all pupils bring their school jumper on the night, these will be removed as part of the performance. There is no need to make these dirty.

Pupils who are acting need to wear as follows:

- Matilda- A blue dress and a red headband- the headband will need to be easily removed as it needs to come off during the performance.
- Miss Honey – A dress and a cardigan- any colour will do.
- Miss Trunchbull – Tracksuit bottoms and a hoody. Hair needs to be in a tight bun. If you own a thick belt please can this be brought in to wear around the waist, if not one can be provided.
- Harry (Dad) A hat and a suit- any colour.
- Zinnia (Mum) A dress and heels- if possible.
- Narrator 1 and 2 – Shirt and black trousers.
- Miss Aaron – Dress and cardigan (any colour)
- Mr Martin- A suit
- Mikey- Jeans and a top- fairly scruffy

All other students- same as the dancing section but with a school cardigan/jumper over the top.
