Pupils will have opportunities to ask questions in lessons and also each classroom will have a confidential feedback box where children are able to ask questions which will be addressed in the safe environment of the classroom.

Parents/Carers have the right to withdraw their children from the, non-statutory/non-science, components of sex education within RSE. Requests for withdrawal should be put in writing, using the form found in appendix 2 of the [RSE policy](#), and addressed to the head teacher. Please note that at Norwood Primary School, the RSE content that parents/carers can withdraw their children from is only delivered in *Year 6*.

The children participating in the sessions are reminded that all learning and discussions held should be kept confidential. However, as we are aware that the children may choose to discuss their learning in the playground and outside of school. This may mean children withdrawn from the sex education sessions could hear pieces of information regardless and in an environment that is away from the safety of the adult led discussions in the classroom.

PSHE education is taught throughout the school in every year group and is monitored and reviewed regularly by the staff and governing body.
