


Norwood Primary School SEND NEWSLETTER Autumn 2 - 2021

It may be that you have to keep some things the same and avoid others, just to ensure your children are at ease and as calm as possible.

I am always on the lookout for family support options as, even with a diagnosis, many families find themselves at a loss with how to support their child's needs. To support families at any time of year, there are many charities that offer advice.

Government Funded Online Accredited Courses

The Aim Group have received Government Funding in the Adult Education Budget. They have several **Free** Online Level 2 Accredited Courses available to help better understand some key issues around young people's mental health and wellbeing.

Courses are completed within in a 10-week window and are completed on the learner's own laptop, computer, or tablet. No Exams, end point assessments are involved, the courses are purely Q&A based and are available to you 24/7. You can do as many as you like, however you can just do one at a time.

Courses available include:

Autism (learn how individuals process sensory information, understand characteristics, understand conditions, learn how speech, language and communication differ in people with Autism)

Children and Young Peoples Mental Health

(Understand factors which may affect Young Peoples mental health, the impact and how to support them) **Behaviour That Challenges** (supporting positive behaviour, effective communication and how to manage challenging behaviour)

Specific Learning Difficulties

(understand characteristics of ADHD, ADD, Dyslexia & Dyscalculia, importance of early diagnosis, assessment methods available to diagnose learning difficulties)

The only criteria the learner must meet to be eligible, is:

- Aged 19 or over on or before 31st August 2021
- Have lived in the UK/EU for 3+ years
- Not already on a Government funded course (Apprenticeship for example)

Social Stories are usually short, simple and have defined criteria to make them "Social Stories". There are lots of ready-made social stories available.


