Dear Parents/Carers,

Welcome to the last and final term in Year 3! It looks as though next term will be very exciting and full of fantastic learning opportunities for the children! Next term our topic is titled 'Take one picture.'

MAIN LEARNING THEME –

The themes are Science, History and Art based and will include many practical activities for the children to participate in. We are going to complete many activities including researching artists, methods of creating art and writing activities surrounding characters within a painting.

LEARNING SKILLS –

We will be focusing in on the following 4 skills: Speaking and Listening.

- I can talk confidently about something I am interested in to an audience.
- I can listen carefully to the views of others and usually respond appropriately to show I have listened e.g. by making comments, asking questions.
- I can show that I can take my turn when speaking in a larger group or with the whole class.
- I can discuss a piece of work with others in a small group and begin to give suggestions for others to follow.

NUMERACY

We will be working using the National Numeracy framework. All of the units will be building on the skills and learning the children developed in the Key Stage 1. These include methods for Addition and Subtraction, Data handling, Measure and Shape. Next term we will be focussing A3: Counting, partitioning and calculating, B3: Securing number facts and shape and C3: Handling Data and measure.

LITERACY

Following the success of Read, Write Inc phonics, Norwood have invested in the programme Read, Write Inc Literacy and Language. The aim of this programme is to continue the good progress from the phonics programme in Key Stage 1, and therefore embed skills through regular exposure to phonics alongside quality texts that develop their comprehension and writing skills.

It is vital that pupils are able to read fluently and confidently before being exposed to the new programme. Therefore, we are currently in the process of assessing pupils' reading ability across school. This will ensure that each child accesses literacy learning at an appropriate level regardless of their age group. From the beginning of the Spring Term, each child will access either Read, Write Inc Phonics, Read, Write Inc Fresh Start or Read, Write Inc Language and Literacy. Children will be regularly assessed and parents will be kept informed of their progress, with the aim that all children will eventually be accessing the Literacy and Language programme. Children that are already accessing additional support for reading will continue to access this alongside the Read, Write Inc provision.

PE

PE will be on Tuesdays and Fridays. PE will be covered in two one hour sessions each week. Please ensure your child has both indoor and outdoor kit in school with them all week. Children with long hair will need to have it tied back for safety reasons. Any earrings (studs only are allowed in school) will also have to be removed (by the child) or covered with a plaster (which must be supplied from home).

HOME LEARNING

Your child will receive a weekly activity in their Learning Logs, this will be given out on a Wednesday and should be returned on a Tuesday. Every Tuesday, one Learning Log per class is chosen to be shared in the whole school assembly on Thursday. Your child will also be awarded House Points for the work produced in their Learning Logs. The way in which the work is presented is entirely up to the child. In addition, there will be key skills literacy and/or numeracy homework set.

Home learning is expected to be completed each week at home and handed in on time by Tuesday. If children do not meet this requirement then they will complete the home learning during break time. Can you please ensure that your child completes their home learning each week. If you have any questions please do not hesitate to contact the class teacher.

In addition to this, your child can choose to undertake a half-term home learning project, which could be the focus of their homework for the beginning of the term. This project is not compulsory, but is a fantastic way to involve family and friends in their learning. This can involve the whole family and should be linked to our topic theme; the more creative the better!

READING

Please continue to read with your child at home. Each week, they will be given 1 or 2 reading books which they can share with you at home and will be changed weekly. Year 3 have the opportunity to visit the library and learn about all the different types of books and how to use a library. Each week, your child will also participate in 'Guided Reading' where they will have the chance to join in with plenty of 'book talk'. Please ensure their reading books and records are in school every day.
