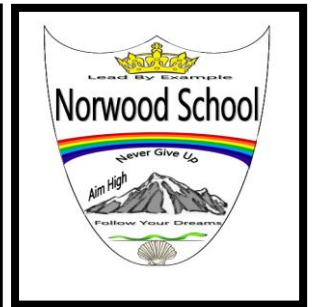

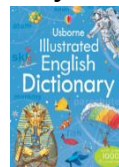


Our school engagement programme for Years 3, 4, 5, 6 Unfortunately, there is a problem with the monthly data from Bedrock and there is nothing to share at this time.

Norwood School Reading Buddies are volunteers who work in school, with children to develop their confidence to read and discuss a book.

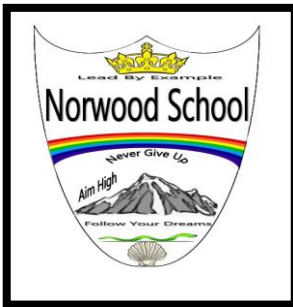


- Are able to commit to an hour each week for at least one school term.

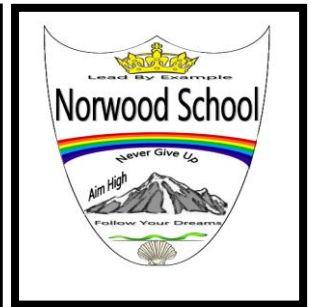
