I have shared the Vivacity Summer Reading Challenge with all of the children in school. The Vivacity Summer Reading Challenge is free to join and can be a great way to keep your child engaged with reading as well as a free activity to keep the family busy over the Summer break. To complete the challenge, you will need to register at any of the Vivacity libraries to receive a challenge pack.

Children need to read 6 books over the course of the challenge, so if your child reads slowly, I would suggest choosing some picture books and non-fiction texts as well as novels to meet the challenge. This year, there is also a website linked to the challenge which has a section to support your child in choosing new book titles, playing book themed activities and games.




Roald Dahl Story Day is an annual celebration of Roald Dahl stories from Matilda to Charlie and The Chocolate Factory.

Our school engagement programme for Years 3, 4, 5, 6 Bedrock online learning usage by class defined by level of usage.




Months are displayed by letter: M=March A=April M=May


