

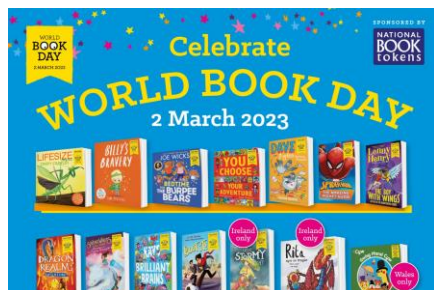

On **Thursday 2nd March**, we are inviting our pupils to dress up as a book character or come to school in their pyjamas to celebrate World Book Day! Children are welcome to change into their slippers once in class or add in a dressing gown. Please ensure that your child/children have their school shoes/ trainers with them to wear at break and lunch.

Please don't spend lots of money on costumes. If your child doesn't like dressing up or wearing pyjamas, they are welcome to come to school in

non-uniform.

World Book Day is all about getting all children reading and helping them to enjoy it. If reading is fun, children are more likely to choose to read; and the more they read, the more they will learn.

All children will receive a World Book Day voucher to exchange at participating shops for a specially written World Book Day book or for £1 off any book.

Research suggests that one in five children in England do not own a book of their own. With this in mind, we will be holding a 'Books for You' market during the school day where children can browse books that are no longer needed in the library or donated to school and take these home for free.
