

You will have noticed changes to our car park. We now have a barrier in place and the disabled parking bays should be in use in the near future.

We have also had a new fire alarm system installed. The new system has heat and smoke detection. It also has visible beacons to assist hearing impaired children in the event of a fire.

As part of this installation there is an automated timing system, that through a series of bleeps signifies the time that the classroom doors open and close at the start of the school day.
