Saturday 14th February 2026

Each eligible child/young person will be issued a **£10** voucher using a link sent by email and/or text. It may arrive at **any** time during that day. Please wait until **Sunday 15th February** to contact us about any missing vouchers. You can contact us at holidayvouchersupport@peterborough.gov.uk. Please include in your email the name of your child, their date of birth and which school, college or early year setting they attend.

Sunday 22nd February 2026

Last day for newly eligible children and young people to be included in the February Half-Term Holiday voucher round.

Sunday 15th March 2026 - 9:00 pm

Last day for Vouchers to be activated. The voucher does not need to be spent by this date, just activated by using the link to select the required retailer. If not activated, it will become invalid and won't be re-issued.

Appendix 1 – Eligible Children and Young People

Date of birth between 1st January 2023 and 31st December 2023 AND attend a Peterborough Early Years Provider (2 year old funded)

- Eligible for 'Disadvantage entitlement - 2-year-old funding' = **YES** eligible ✓
- Eligible for 'Working Parent Entitlement - 2-year-old funding' = **NO** not eligible X

You can find eligibility criteria and links to apply for both types of funding on the [15 hours funded childcare for 2-year-olds](#) page of the [Peterborough City Council](#) website.

Date of birth between 1st January 2021 and 31st March 2025 AND attend a Peterborough Early Years Provider (9 months to 4 years old)

- Eligible for Early Years Pupil Premium (EYPP) = **YES** eligible ✓

Details of the eligibility criteria for EYPP can be found at <https://www.gov.uk/get-extra-early-years-funding>

Your child's Pre-school, Nursery or Childminder will need to run the online check to tell you if your child is eligible for EYPP. You will also need to ask them to notify us of your contact details to allow us to send the voucher link. They can email the voucher team at holidayvouchersupport@peterborough.gov.uk.

Date of birth between 1st September 2009 and 31st August 2021 AND attend a Peterborough School (Reception to Year 11)

- Eligible for 'Income Based Free School Meals' = **YES** eligible ✓
- Receiving 'Universal Infant Free School Meals' = **NO** not eligible X

You can find eligibility criteria and links to apply for 'Income based Free School Meals' on the [Free School Meals](#) page of the [Peterborough City Council](#) website.

Our systems are shared with Cambridgeshire County Council who deliver our eligibility checking service. There are 11 Peterborough schools, who are listed on the [Free School Meals](#) page, who use different checking services so you will need to apply directly to those schools.

Please Note - All children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 are eligible for Universal Infant Free School Meals if they are in a government-funded school. This is **NOT** one of the criteria for receiving the voucher.

Date of birth between 1st September 2006 and 31st August 2009 AND live in Peterborough (6th Form or College)

- Eligible for 'Income Based Free School Meals' AND enrolled in Further Education provision funded by the Department for Education (DfE) = **YES** eligible ✓
 - On an Apprenticeship, including those with an Education, Health and Care Plan = **NO** not eligible X

Students aged 19 or over on 1st September 2025 AND enrolled in Further Education provision funded by the Department for Education (DfE) AND live in Peterborough

- Eligible for free school meals AND Continuing on a study programme they began aged 16 to 18 ('19+ continuers') = **YES** eligible ✓
 - Have an Education, Health and Care Plan (EHCP) AND Continuing on a study programme they began aged 16 to 18 ('19+ continuers') = **YES** eligible ✓
 - Aged 19 to 25 AND have an Education, Health and Care Plan (EHCP) AND accesses the bursary scheme OR Free School Meals in their college = **YES** eligible ✓
